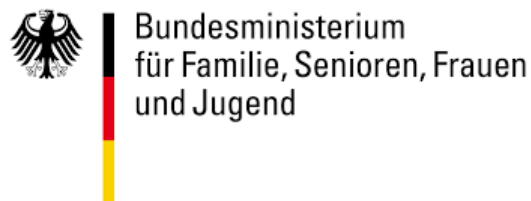
Migration and war

Double standards for protection and prospects?

The Russian unlawful armed attack on Ukraine resulted, in addition to the suffering and destruction in Ukraine, in the fastest growing refugee movement since the end of Second World War. After years of political dispute between EU member states on European migration and refugee policy, a new consensus appears to have emerged - at least on the protection of Ukrainian refugees. The current changes provide hope for a future development of European asylum policy that is more robustly based on human rights. However the strong contrast to the previous position of EU member states remains: Open borders and freedom to choose a state of reception for some, walls and push-backs for others?

The consequences of the war in Ukraine will significantly determine and have a lasting impact on European migration law and policy in the coming years. The fall conference of the Network Migration Law therefore asks whether the EU and its member states are applying double standards when providing protection to people fleeing wars and other human rights violations. At the same time, the deviation from previous basic principles, such as the responsibility of the first country of entry, might be a stimulus for new impulses in the reform of European refugee policy. The conference will also take into account comparable experiences in other regions of the world where large-scale refugee movements occurred. The conference welcomes interdisciplinary presentations of the topics and offers a space for critical progressive debates. In addition to the cross-conference theme, other current and practice-relevant topics from the field of migration law will be addressed in the conference workshops.
